



# Lake Lavon Capacity (1990-2015)



# NTMWD

- NTMWD Model Water Conservation Plan & Water Resource and Emergency Management Plan (Drought Plan) were adopted in February 2014.
- The Model Emergency Management Plan (Drought Plan) moves to a 3 Stage Plan from a 4 Stage Plan. The voluntary stage (Stage 1 is eliminated).
- The Water Conservation Plan provides for twice a week watering (April to October) and once a week watering (November to March).



# NTMWD

- NTMWD is moving from the Water Resource and Emergency Management Plan (Drought Plan), Stage 3 enhanced, once every other week watering to the Water Conservation Plan which provides for twice a week watering (April to October) and once a week watering (November to March), effective May 1, 2015.
- NTMWD wants to emphasize that **you should only water as needed up to the allowed number of days.**



# Plano

- Plano revised its Drought and Emergency Response Plan by Ordinance on April 28, 2014.
- The Water Management Plan was adopted on the same day by Resolution.
- Resolutions cannot be enforced.
- Staff will revise its Drought and Emergency Response Plan to move to the 3 Stage Plan. This was not done before to eliminate confusion of changing the number of stages while we were still under the Drought Plan.




# Plano

- An Ordinance is on tonight's agenda that will adopt twice a week watering (April to October) and once a week watering (November to March).
- The Ordinance also address the filling of ponds with city water, time of day restrictions and the type of splash pads that are allowed among other things
- This Ordinance will reduce the amount of water that Plano purchases in the future and will impact the amount of water that we will not use and still have to pay for.
